

here to experience the wonders of the stable. They rode, roped, branded, danced, composted, and toured the stable. It went so well that we are continuing the program this summer. On alternate Mondays, we'll be leading more groups. This is a great way to expose the next generation to the wonders of horses. A flyer is included for anyone you know that might be interested.

They have also created a program for children 3-5 that is sensory based. This two hour program is a way for both the child and parent(s) to share an experience, as well as have a positive first exposure to farm animals.

With their efforts, the academy is becoming more than just learning specific skills. Instead, it's

about experiencing horses on a much deeper level. For many, the competitive world of sports does not appeal to them. Instead the cooperative nature of riding, has many benefits: connecting to animals, learning responsibility, and experiencing tranquility.

On the long term project list is a home school "app" for the riding academy that will incorporate horses, but through a science / math lens. We are not talking about the trick horses at county fairs that do differential equations, but students using horses for hands-on teaching of these subjects. This has been a passion of Susie for many years, and she brings great enthusiasm to its development.

From the Accounting Department

We're making minor adjustments to how the board bill is delineated in your monthly statement. This is more of an internal adjustment, reallocating the labor costs from feeding to boarding. When tested against June's billing it is as they say "revenue neutral". For some individuals there might be a slight difference of a few dollars one way or the other, but again overall, there is no change. These rates will take effect August 1st. Baled orchard and timothy will also be reduced by the similar 14%. Please see the revised rate sheet included at the end of the newsletter.

Once again the Hedgepth Sensory Clinic train will be passing through town stopping at Serrano on July 22. This ever popular clinic is a great way to build trust between rider and horse. We're lucky to have some nice trails connected to the stable, and this clinic will assist you being more confident when dealing with the unexpected.

As the summer heat arrives, please give a little attention to your horse's waterer. While doing experiments recreating the origins of life has it value, it's best to leave these for the laboratory. Horses drink more when the waterer is clean. And more water drunk means less colics!


