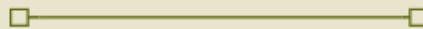

As the winter season approaches, we would like to inform our new boarders about the steps we take each year to prepare the stalls for colder, wetter conditions.



Beginning in late October and continuing through November, we undertake a thorough winterization process. There is no action required on your part; our team manages the entire procedure!!! This includes removing existing shavings, cleaning each stall of all the wet footing, and replenishing the base with a combination of decomposed granite (DG) and clean bird's eye gravel.

Winterization will start Monday, October 27 with the stalls along the park, then move to the back breezeway and nearby stalls. Please pause adding new shavings until each stall is finished. Our crew will reuse any clean shavings when possible.

During this time, we also inspect the French drain system to ensure it is functioning correctly and providing proper drainage.

These measures are essential in maintaining a clean, dry, and comfortable environment for the horses throughout the winter months. For more information, please feel free to contact the office.

Is Your Horse's Emergency Treatment Authorization Form Up to Date?

When was the last time you updated your horse's Emergency Treatment Authorization Form?

Emergencies can happen unexpectedly, and having accurate, up-to-date information ensures we can provide your horse with the best possible care, even if you can't be reached right away.

Please take a moment to:

- ◆ Review your current contact information
- ◆ Confirm your preferred veterinarian and emergency contacts
- ◆ Update any insurance or payment details

If it's been more than a year (or if you've changed vets, phone numbers, or contact preferences), we ask that you complete a new form.

How to Update:

Please stop by the barn office, or you can find the form attached to this email. Once you've updated it, be sure to forward a copy to your veterinarian so they have it on file as well.

Keeping these records, current helps us act quickly and responsibly in an emergency, giving you peace of mind and your horse the care they deserve.

Just a quick note to help keep the barn safe and tidy for everyone!

Please make sure all hay and grain bags are stored in a feed box or your tack shed within 24 hours of delivery. Leaving bags out

not only clutters the aisles but also attracts unwanted guests like mice, bugs, and other wildlife. Plus, it's something we're required to do as part of the water quality rules.

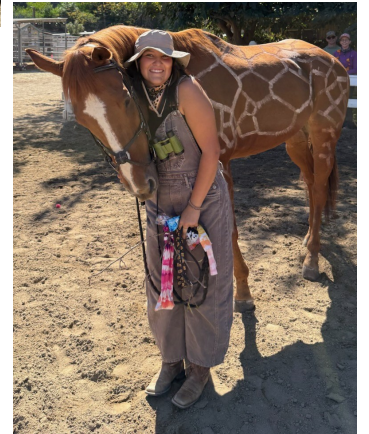
If you keep feed in a metal can outside your stall, make sure the lids are tightly secured with a bungee cord. Horses are curious and have been known to get into feed, especially at night if stall gates are accidentally left unlocked, so this helps avoid any accidents or surprise midnight snacks.

Also, any tools like rakes, brooms, or forks should be tied down or stored safely. Loose items can be dangerous; there have been serious accidents, even a few tragic ones when horses have pulled tools inside their stalls. And if a horse ever gets loose, those tools can become a real hazard. If you don't have room in front of your stall, feel free to store your gear in your tack shed instead.
